


OUR VISION

There's a school just a block from my house and I sometimes stand and watch the children going to school in the morning. I think back to the time, over 50 years ago, when I would similarly have been entering my school. I wonder if the feeling I then had, of excitement at meeting my school friends, of dread at the thought of an impending exam, of anticipation waiting for the games period or lunchtime, has changed. I guess not. Feelings and emotions don't change much, but then the world in which today's children grow up has certainly changed dramatically from my times.



What has changed the world most is Technology. Probably changes the greatest are invention of the personal and the internet. computer These have probably driven most other changes that have taken place subsequently - in fact only in the last 20 years. Add to that the popularization

of Satellite communication and today's indispensable device – the smartphone. So what are the changes that I see, from the point of view of a today's school going child?

Abundance of information and easy access to it is probably one of the foremost. Where once I would have to go to a library and hunt through several books for some information, you can now merely type in a key word into Google and you can get ample references from the search. Hence there is greater awareness of the world around and a greater social consciousness and sense of responsibility in today's children for what is happening around them and what they can do to make the world a better place.

The second is communication. In my time, I would have had to travel, sometimes long distances, to get to meet my friend or family. Now they have been virtually brought to our living room through the mobile, Skype, WhatsApp, Facebook and other Social media.

There would be great excitement at home if my father booked tickets for a movie – perhaps once in few months. Now there are video games on the mobile, movies on television or even livestreaming on demand and platforms like YouTube can be a constant source of entertainment. Extending the Family..

Selection process is that time of the year when Pragati family grows bigger in strength. It is that time when new students full of aspirations and dreams are shown the path to progress and brought under one umbrella - called Pragati.

The path, however, is not laden with roses. To get under this umbrella, the students have to be able to work hard, excel not just in their academics but in other activities as well and-prove that they need the assistance.



And the means of selecting the most deserving ones among these set of students is through our carefully crafted selection process. Ours is a two-pronged approach. A meticulously crafted written test followed by a rigorous interview - the interview is not only with the student but also with their parents to understand the holistic situation.

On 24th of June, students along with their parents had assembled at the Rotary, Malleshwaram. Students were eager to sit for the test, the mentors were equally anxious enough to be able to oversee the process without any glitches.

Around 118 students gave the written test which lasted about an hour.

Shortlisted candidates were then called for interviews by the mentor team which was split to parallelize the process.



Selection process is in a way a test to the mentors as well - a test of their ability to carefully prepare the question paper, control the huge gathering at the venue, conduct unbiased interviews and display unwavering temperament.

After shortlisting the students from written test, mentors started the interviews where they diligently understood the students academics, interests, career choices and last but not the least - financial situation.

At the end of the day, 24 new members joined the Pragati family.

It is not just the financial help that is deemed important for the upcoming scholar but what makes this Pragati association special is the bonding that builds over the course of their career - providing guidance, mentoring and becoming a turnstile to their career development.



VISIT TO IIM-BENGALURU

As if it has become a customary process every year, this year too, Pragati scholars were treated with the experience of visiting IIM-Bengaluru, one of the premier institutes of learning in the country. Indeed, it was a fun filled experience with loads of learning to take home.

To quench a little bit of this robotic interest, we organized a robotics workshop with the help of Robomations, a startup aiming to spread the knowledge of robotics among student communities.

Of course, every sophisticated product begins with a simple prototype. Likewise, the introduction on robotics to students began with basic electrical engineering principles. Every student was provided with a breadboard on which they built small circuit with resistors, LEDs, battery and also buzzer.

Later the students teamed up to build automated car which involved understanding the physics of motor, resistors, gears and wheels. They also tried soldering for the first time.

There were some entrepreneurship lessons as well and directions for choosing one's passion.

This was one of those events which was intense, yet fun-filled and a fulfilling experience for the students. This event for sure would have inspired some of them to go explore the world of technology and choose it as their career in the future.
